Food (In) compatibilities – Cultural (In) compatibilities


What is really the hunger for the human being of the 21st century? How do we understand the cultural heritage of food? How does this define the stratification of society and how, together with its methods of satisfaction, has it become science and art as well?

A rigorously scientific look at the interplay of three layers of fundamental analysis has led to an absolutely original meeting of several points of view:

I. Satisfying the Hunger (Cultural and Medical Approach)

II. Taste and Disgust (Cultural and Medical Approach)

III. Integration/ incorporation with Cultural and Medical Consequences In the broader and inter-disciplinary, inclusive context of the conference the thematic cluster Medicine and Food convened by professor Slobodan Dan Paich brings researches from Archeological deciphering of conifer tablets with specific recopies, continuity of foraging wild edible plants tradition to the practices of Ayurvedic Medicine foods carefully researched and continuously practiced since prehistory. The researches brought in the Medicine and Food cluster include geographies larger than the European Cultural Sphere and ancient and indigenous people as differently cultured, ingénues and refined rather than primitive. Also, food preparation is at the root of cultural experiences and sharing, often considered adjunct and not as an inseparable from



medical practices. Medicine and Food cluster address tangible and intangible heritage, comparative cultural studies and migration of peoples, craft technics and ideas and it is the intended contribution to Humanities and Medical Disciplines.

In the often self-involved, incomprehensible gestures of Established Contemporary Art Practices Gabriela Luca sees the Art of Living as both a metaphorical and experiential nexus for understanding and practicing regenerative function of food in recovery processes.

The great Hippocrates said that food must be our medicine and the medicine must be our food. Medicine is an art because it uses all five senses to form its full knowledge of the human being and its environment and is undoubtedly a science because it is verified by evidence. Therefore, it is the science and art of medicine, as physical and nourishment. From spiritual the anthropological point of view, eating means to ingest qualities, but also defects. Digestion is a double process: assimilation and distribution through transformation. And this extends to existence between taste and disgust.

The difference between us – homo sapiens – and other species is precisely that we have transformed food into art and science. Under the simple concept that living is an art, in this conference specialists in the humanities and doctors, artists in fine arts and masters in gastronomy form an effervescent round table, they speak and work in joint workshops to share and enrich our knowledge.
